




Accessibility

Private funds allowed MCPL to establish the Access Fund in March to improve existing services for all ages and abilities. Through the generosity of our donors, the Access Fund reached **\$50,000** (double the initial goal of \$25,000) and supports greater capacity for American sign language interpretation, assistive listening devices, translation services, and captioning. In addition, the Access Fund supports the expansion of the Library By Mail program serving homebound readers and sensory sensitive storytimes serving children with processing sensitivities.

Summer Library Program

The Summer Library Program is MCPL's most important offering to improve literacy for youth in our community. MCPL serves almost 20,000 young readers each summer and distributes nearly 10,000 books as prizes to build home libraries. The Summer Reading Endowment ensures that this program will continue to thrive for years to come. In 2022, donors gave more than \$30,000 to the Endowment to provide future access to books, educational activities, and free programs every summer.



Technology

Private funds and grants through the Missouri State Library facilitated the purchase of new and replacement early literacy station computers at 15 MCPL branches.

These stations are pre-loaded with more than 4,000 educational activities, games and eBooks geared toward our youngest readers. The early literacy stations logged more than **50,000** sessions this year!


The Memory Lab was another grant-funded project that provided Library patrons with a digitization lab designed to preserve family history. The Memory Lab is a do-it-yourself space that provides equipment for digitizing materials such as home movies, audio tapes, recipe books, and family photographs. The Lab educates and empowers customers to preserve their personal history and family stories for generations to come. Accepted formats at the Lab include VHS tapes, cassette tapes, photos, documents, photo negatives, and slides. The Lab was launched at The Story Center (Woodneath Library Campus) and moved to The Midwest Genealogy Center in the summer.

Library Programs

Early Literacy Outreach

When families and children can't make it to the Library, the MCPL Reading Rocket Team comes to them. The Reading Rocket team visits high-need areas within the MCPL District's three-county area to deliver mobile storytimes, literacy activities, and giveaway books to build home libraries. This year, donors provided funds for more than 10,000 "forever books" given to local kids to encourage reading and family literacy.
